Overview

Name: Shanghai University of Medicine & Health Sciences(SUMHS) Nature: Full-time undergraduate institution of higher education

Historical Background: Established in 2015 through the merger of three higher vocational colleges

Student Rights and Obligations

Rights:

- Access to fair education
- Participate in social and recreational activities
- Receive fair evaluations and corresponding certificates
- Apply for scholarships, grants, etc.
- Stay informed about school reforms and development
- Participate in democratic school management

Obligations:

- Comply with laws, regulations, and school rules
- Study diligently, be honest and trustworthy
- Adhere to academic norms
- Care for educational equipment and living facilities

Student Enrollment Management

Admission and Registration:

- New students must pass the admission review
- Register and pay tuition fees on time each semester

Attendance and Discipline:

- Students must attend teaching activities on time and follow the leave procedure
- Appropriate penalties for absences, tardiness, and early departures

Assessment and Grades:

- Course assessments include exams and evaluations
- Grades are based on a combination of regular and final exam performance
- Special assessment methods for ideological and moral character and physical education

Major and School Transfer:

- Eligible students can apply to change majors or transfer schools
- Procedures must be followed for approval

Leave of Absence and Readmission

Conditions for Leave:

- Illness, entrepreneurship, special reasons, etc.

Readmission Process:

- Upon completion of the leave period, readmission is possible after approval

Withdrawal and Academic Warning

Withdrawal Scenarios:

- Including unauthorized absence from classes for two consecutive weeks

Academic Warning:

- Students with failing grades will receive academic warnings, and severe cases may lead to withdrawal

Rewards and Punishments

Rewards:

- Recognize outstanding students with scholarships and honors

Punishments:

- Disciplinary actions ranging from warnings to expulsion for violations

Extracurricular Activities and Clubs

- Social Practice: Students can earn credits for participating in social practice
- Club Activities: Students can join or initiate club activities, adhering to relevant regulations

Student Organizations and Management

- Student Union: Represents student interests and organizes various activities
- Club Management: Student clubs must register and receive school guidance

Campus Safety and Life

- Campus Safety: Adhere to campus safety regulations, prohibit unauthorized use of open flames, etc.
- Dormitory Management: Students must comply with dormitory rules and maintain a regular schedule

Grievance Mechanism

- Grievance Process: Students can file grievances with the school's grievance handling committee if they have objections to disciplinary actions
